

### GRANTS FOR INNOVATIVE TEACHING Presenting Sponsor Texas Instruments

# T. Boone Pickens Leadership Institute

Established in 2008, the *T. Boone Pickens Leadership Institute* is a yearlong executive leadership development program for League volunteers. Over 350 hand-selected scholars have participated in the program, which serves as a springboard for graduates to make a significant impact in the League and the greater Dallas community.
