The Leadership Council implements the programs and policies of the Junior League of Dallas. These leaders and their committees govern their respective responsibilities within the policies set by the Board.



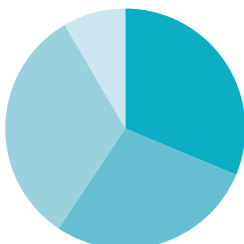

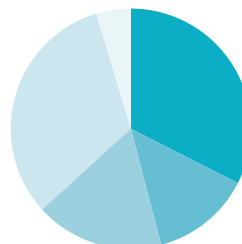

SIGNATURE PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

DALLAS MAYOR'S BACK TO SCHOOL FAIR

The Junior League of Dallas was proud to partner again this year with the Mayor's Office, DISD, nonprofits, corporations, and community volunteers for the *Mayor's Back to School Fair*. As a League, we believe that every child should feel excited for their first day of school and have no worries about having everything they need to succeed. The League has worked tirelessly to recruit and train nearly 500 volunteers who included JLD members and the community. These volunteers welcomed the 10,000+ families and informed attendees about the services and supplies children will need to make a strong start. The League also worked with partners to feature 100+ vendors who provided information, services, and supplies that included immunizations, dental screenings, vision exams, and other health and social services that kids may not be able to access elsewhere. For 28 years, the *Mayor's Back to School Fair* has helped prepare the children of Dallas for success and included local school mascots, Dallas sports team mascots, and representatives from various Dallas organizations to foster a fun fair environment to help get kids excited for the new school year. The League hopes that families feel a sense of community leading into this new school year and that this event will help poise each of these students for achieving success.

KIDS IN THE KITCHEN

This year's *Kids in the Kitchen* (KITK) Train the Trainer event took place on Friday, January 31, 2025. The program empowers youth to make healthy lifestyle choices and combats the rise of childhood obesity and related health issues through a five-week fitness and nutrition education initiative. The committee is dedicated to raising awareness and educating our membership on important health topics. Supported by the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI) Inc. and its member Leagues, KITK is a nationally recognized health education program. This year alone, we reached over 3,000 children and parents in Dallas County with lessons focused on nutrition fundamentals, healthy cooking, and sustaining a healthy lifestyle.

WOMEN LEAD

On Saturday, March 29, 2025, the Junior League of Dallas (JLD) celebrated the voices and visions of the future as it awarded \$39,000 in collegiate scholarships to nine remarkable college-bound women from Dallas ISD during the 12th annual *Women LEAD* Speech Competition and Awards Ceremony. Thank you to our fabulous emcee, Chief Relationships Officer at Communities Foundation of Texas and JLD Sustainer Calvert Collins-Bratton, for leading the evening with grace and energy. Selected from a highly competitive pool of 29 applicants representing Emmett J. Conrad High School, Thomas Jefferson High School, and South Oak Cliff High School, the nine finalists delivered inspiring speeches to a panel of distinguished judges including Tandra Allen, JLD President; Tiffanie Rice, Comerica Bank VP of Regional External Affairs; and Jennifer Bartkowski, Girl Scouts of Northeast Texas CEO.

Since its inception in 2013, *Women LEAD* has awarded 82 scholarships totaling \$385,000 to deserving seniors from three area high schools—underscoring JLD's commitment to education, empowerment, and equity for young women.

Following the oratory competition, held at the Junior League of Dallas Headquarters, the judging panel tallied the votes and determined the winners based on the merits of their scholarship application and speech presentation.

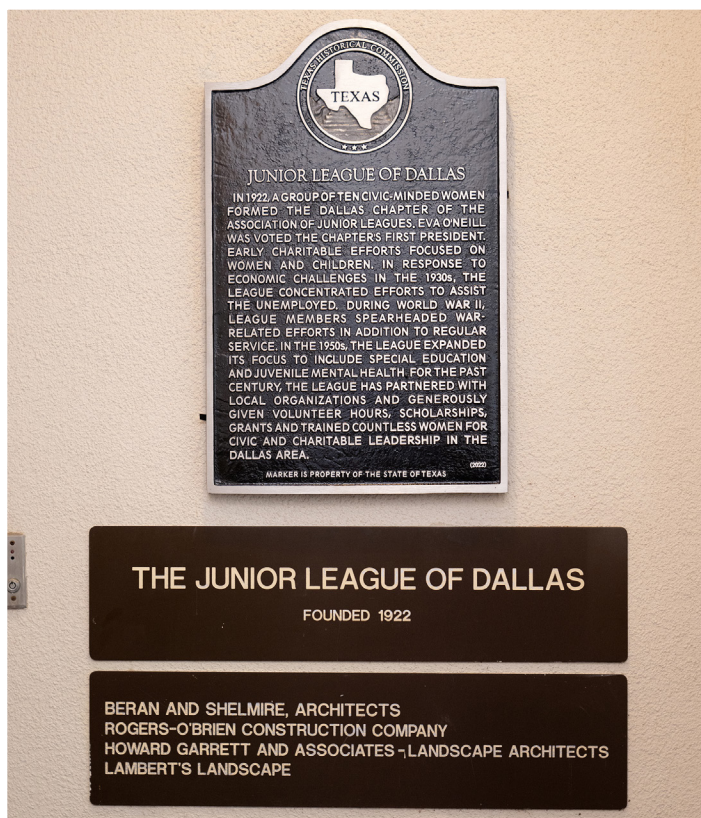

HISTORICAL MARKER COMMEMORATION EVENT



On September 9, 2024, the Junior League of Dallas (JLD) unveiled a **Texas Historical Commission Marker** at their Headquarters, commemorating over a century of dedicated service to the Dallas community. This marker honors the unwavering commitment of JLD members to initiatives that have significantly enhanced the lives of women and children since the organization's inception in 1922.

DECADES OF IMPACT

1920s: Following its formation, the JLD concentrated on two main volunteer activities: The Handicapped Shop and the Junior League Home for Convalescent Children.

1930s: The League expanded its focus to address unemployment, implementing programs aimed at providing relief and support to those affected by the economic challenges of the Great Depression.

1940s: During World War II, JLD members spearheaded efforts to support the community through various wartime initiatives, demonstrating resilience and adaptability in times of crisis.

1950s: The organization turned its attention to special education and juvenile mental health, advocating for and establishing programs that addressed the unique needs of these populations.

1950s & Beyond: The League deepened its community footprint through expanded focus areas, robust training of women civic leaders, tens of thousands of volunteer hours donated annually, and sustained investments in the Dallas community through strategic partnerships, grants, and scholarships.

The historical marker not only acknowledges these pivotal contributions but also celebrates the enduring legacy of the JLD. During the Unveiling Ceremony, JLD President Tandra Allen aptly stated, *"Every time we pass these steps and view this marker, we are continuing to contribute to a legacy."*

UNVEILING CEREMONY

The unveiling ceremony brought together JLD members to reflect on their shared history and reaffirm their commitment to future service. The event featured refreshments at the JLD headquarters, fostering fellowship and gratitude among attendees. This gathering served as a poignant reminder of the organization's mission and the collective impact of its members over the past century.

This historical marker stands as a testament to the Junior League of Dallas' century-long dedication to voluntarism and community improvement. It not only honors past achievements but also inspires current and future members to continue the tradition of impactful service.

Held on Friday, February 21, 2025, the Junior League of Dallas welcomed more than 150 women to its headquarters for a memorable **Women's Leadership Summit**, moderated by Monica Christopher, the president of Texas Woman's University, and Sarah Jackson, the associate vice president of HTNB. This symposium featured trailblazers from across the city, sharing their journeys to success and how to walk in purpose and passion every single day, with the overall theme of Trailblazing with purpose.

Gillea Allison, president of D Magazine, discussed the ins and outs of what it means to be a strong leader in her industry, staying innovative while still mission-focused, and being committed to leading with purpose. Hilda Galvan, former partner-in-charge of the Dallas office of Jones Day, shared how she has overcome challenges as a Hispanic woman in her industry, as well as sharing her story of how she created collaboration among stakeholders to create positive impact in Dallas and for the state of Texas. Laurie Grace Roberts, the CEO and founder of Rethink Results, culminated a magnificent line-up by illustrating her passion for helping career-driven women build their leadership style and navigate a work and life balance so they are both moving forward with their career and thriving at the same time.

Some other overall key takeaways throughout the symposium included the importance of advocating for oneself in professional settings, leaning into purpose-driven work, and seeking out sponsors/mentors to accelerate career advancement. These inspiring panelists shared actionable strategies for maintaining a sustainable career while incorporating personal priorities and an overall sense of balance.

The event concluded with a call to action, encouraging attendees to actively support and uplift other women in their respective fields. This event was a great success, leaving female attendees of all ages and backgrounds feeling inspired, uplifted, and ready to make a lasting impact. By fostering mentorship and advocating for equity, participants left with a renewed commitment to shaping a more inclusive and empowering professional environment.



JLD LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE - T. BOONE PICKENS VISIONARY AWARD

Junior League of Dallas Leadership Institute was established in 2008 as the T. Boone Pickens Leadership Institute through a generous gift from T. Boone Pickens. His lead gift to develop the potential of women leaders for Dallas, has enabled over 440 members to participate and graduate from the program. Today, the JLD Leadership Institute continues to develop the leadership skills of a selected annual class of members through their participation in a 10-month development and leadership course. Graduates of the JLD Leadership Institute leave motivated to impact the Dallas community and equipped with the knowledge and skills to bring positive and effective change.

The Leadership Institute also announced the inaugural T. Boone Pickens Visionary Award and awarded a distinguished alumna with the honor and recognition. The T. Boone Pickens Visionary Award was established in recognition of the vision that T. Boone Pickens had to advance the mission of JLD and in celebrating the spirit of the program's impact to collectively address the critical needs in our community. One honoree is to be selected each year who is a distinguished alumna of the program and has demonstrated elevated leadership talents and skills because of her Leadership Institute training. Specifically, she has used her training to impact the League and community in a visionary, innovative manner to honor the spirit of T. Boone Pickens. As well, she has shown exemplary mentorship abilities. JLD is proud to have many outstanding Leadership alumna who exhibit these outstanding qualities, exemplify leadership skills and training, and who make a difference in the community.

JLD is proud to announce that Lee Gleiser, was selected and recognized for the inaugural **T. Boone Pickens Visionary Award** at this year's Leadership Institute Graduation. Lee is Director of Audience Development at Southern Methodist University's Meadows School of the Arts and credits the Leadership Institute for advancing her skills as an educator and elevating her as a strong presenter. During her time in the League, Lee served actively in the community and then within training programs within the League. She has offered her time and expertise multiple times as a Sustaining advisor, mentoring many League members and future League leaders. She is eager to serve and doesn't hesitate when called upon to be a part of various events. She was a part of the first T. Boone Pickens Leadership Institute Class and credits what she learned there for her confidence and success throughout her career.





The MILESTONES LUNCHEON

The Junior League of Dallas (JLD) held its annual [Milestones Luncheon](#) on Friday, April 11, 2025, at the Omni Dallas Hotel, gathering members, sponsors, and supporters for a meaningful afternoon celebrating leadership, service, and community impact. The event featured special guest Alex Snodgrass—Dallas-based food blogger, three-time New York Times bestselling author, and creator of *The Defined Dish* and *SideDish*—and honored Peggy Sewell as the 2025 Sustainer of the Year.
